

Safe Fruits and Vegetables

~1 Cup per Guinea Pig Twice per Day~

Leaf Lettuce (green leaf, red leaf, romaine)

Bell Peppers (remove seeds)

Carrots

Parsley

Cilantro

Cucumber

Zucchini

Celery Hearts

Tomatoes

Dandelion Greens / Clover

*Spinach

*Kale

*Apple (remove seeds)

*Strawberries

*Raspberries

*Blueberries

All fruits and vegetables should be washed thoroughly before being fed to your guinea pig.

*Denotes a food that should only be fed occasionally and only in small quantities.

Fruits/vegetables that should **NEVER** be fed:

Iceberg Lettuce

Beets

Radishes

All Varieties of Potatoes

Banana

Raisins

Cabbage

Brussel Sprouts

Broccoli
